Teachers **must complete all seven DELTA components** to meet the requirement of the 40-Hour New Teacher Induction Program. The DELTA program is coordinated by the North Carolina State Staff Team and the Agricultural Education faculty at North Carolina State University. A certificate of completion for the 40-Hour New Teacher Induction will be provided upon completion of all seven components.
