#### 10 Tips to Chartering an Affiliate

- 1) Talk to advisors, community individuals, former FFA members and others to survey the interest of creating an FFA Alumni Affiliate.
- 2) Find a small "nucleus" group (10 people) that can work together to organize and charter the alumni- Include advisors, retired advisor and former members who understand what the FFA Chapter is and what can be done to help support it.
- *3) Elect officers for the alumni. Start with the minimum of 4 officers.*
- *4)* Develop a list of goals, mission and vision statements for the affiliate.
- 5) Create and approve a constitution and set of bylaws.
- 6) Contact NCFFA and National FFA to charter the affiliate.
- 7) Plan and hold a chartering ceremony to officially open the affiliate invite sponsors, elected officials and potential members as well as representatives from NC FFA.
- Utilize newspapers, websites and any other available news outlet to inform the community of the newly formed organization and its mission and goals.
- *9) Investigate potential events that will help accomplish the goals set forth by the charter nucleus members.*
- 10) Plan annual meetings (frequency, agenda, food, etc.).

## **Affiliate Spotlight**

#### West Rowan FFA Alumni

Article provided by Jason Chester In an effort to find a funding source for FFA Seniors the West Rowan FFA Alumni started the FFA Oyster Roast. Originally, this was a fundraiser that the masonry program was conducting and as teachers retired and the FFA program gained support within the school and community, the oyster roast became a staple of our yearly fundraising efforts. The alumni council appoints one member as the social chair, this council member is responsible with the organization of the cooking team for the oyster roast and our yearly alumni summer social event. Having one council member focused on the event year round has helped us grow our attendance and add a silent auction to increase the amount of funds that we are raising in one evening. The biggest challenge of planning the oyster roast is determining the cost of a single ticket. This cost remained constant for the first 12 years of the event and for the last three years in order to offset rising input costs we have raised the price to \$50 per person. With one ticket you get all you can eat steamed oysters, fried flounder, boiled shrimp, pork tenderloin (for those who do not prefer seafood), French fries, hush puppies, slaw, and oyster stew. Last year our alumni chapter was able to provide 5 seniors with a lifetime alumni membership and a \$500 cash scholarship from the proceeds of the silent auction, as well as, fully fund the chapters' trip to National FFA Convention from the income of the meal. Because of the longstanding date of the first Saturday in March, we do not see pressure from other fund raisers, however, we have felt the push of tough economic times and several large businesses experiencing layoffs in our community which have prompted us to provide additional incentives to make the night even more enjoyable. All kids kindergarten or younger eat free, our FFA Chapter members are the wait staff for our patrons, we have streamlined this event to allow for the opportunity to pay membership dues and join our e-newsletter group, and we have provided live entertainment from local cloggers and singers. This event has become a landmark social outing for many of our community members and is a highlight of our FFA Alumni and FFA Chapter year.

The big picture for our alumni is to raise funds to support the activities of our FFA Chapter. This event allows us to involve hundreds of individuals in our community in a fun and welcoming event. The basics behind the organization are simple, however, to make the fundraising event work it takes some solid planning, establishing a firm set of goals, and electing committee members who are excited and willing to work. Our alumni chapter has been blessed with very active members and a highly motivated council; the combination of the two has allowed us to maintain this fundraiser for nearly two decades.
